COTR	No (Outlook only)	Yes, email	Yes (occasionally)	Yes. "This material has been copied under license from ACCESS. Resale or further copying of this material is strictly prohibited."
Douglas	No	We send emails via Ariel and can send them as PDFs to an email account	No, ILLs cannot be put on reserve due to copyright.	We stamp periodicals with "This material has been copied under license from ACCESS. Resale or further copying of this material is strictly prohibited." Sometime documents already have a stamp on them from the institution we're borrowing from.
JIBC	No	Yes. We send emails with a pdf attachment with a disclaimer at the bottom advising about permitted uses.	We would if requested, but have not to date	We place a sticker on it advising of permitted uses – but no mention of fair dealing

NLC	No (just Ariel)	No	Yes	Yes, basically the Access Copyright wording

Quest	No	No	If an instructor gives us a clean photocopy, we wouldn't normally question the source. If the photocopy has obvious copyright notices on it, we wouldn't accept it. SFU	Yes (Relais)	Yes, Relais' "post-to-web" service	Not that I am aware of	No. Electronic Delivery to the end user does not allow for this. However, the email that alerts the patron that their article has arrived and is ready to access contains a copyright message and advises the patron that the article is for their personal use only.
